Review the information below and choose which location you'd like to see during this year's Friday afternoon tour. Although you'll only be able to attend one tour, you will have the option of three different locations.

We ask that you be in the hotel lobby at least 15 minutes before the departure time for each tour. The trolley will pick up one group and drop them off at a location, then return for another group, and so on. Each group will have at least 90 minutes for the tours, before getting ready for the trolley to take them back to the hotel. Applicable admission fees will be each person's responsibility upon arrival.

National Ranching Heritage Center	16 acre site houses 48 authentic structures dating back to the 1700s, fully restored and furnished. There is also a museum, currently featuring exhibits on Cattle Rustling, Quanah Parker items, and Western Boots.	Free, but donations are welcome	2:00	3:45
American Wind Power Center... or the Bayer Museum of Agriculture (you choose where to get off, but this is counted as one tour option)	Largest windmill museum in the world; is home to more than 170 rare and fully restored windmills, and a 6000 square foot "Legacy of the Wind mural." Features exhibits dating back to the pioneering days of agriculture, including 71 pedal tractors, 700 collectible toy tractors, a 1920s replica blacksmith shop, a display of miniature houses and trains, and an antique Pullman car out back.	\$5 (for either)	2:30	4:15
Buddy Holly Center	Houses a permanent exhibit dedicated to Holly's life and music, including unique memorabilia donated by family and friends. Also on display are portals by Yvonne Armitage Green.	\$2	3:00	4:45
